Brown, DeWine to appear on PBS 45 & 49 special broadcast

NewsNight Akron expanded to include interviews with senatorial candidates, discussion about Issue 3

KENT, Ohio — Oct. 31, 2006 — PBS 45 & 49 offers a special opportunity to learn more about the candidates and Issue 3 in a format that emphasizes dialogue rather than confrontation. The weekly PBS 45 & 49 news program **NewsNight Akron** will be extended on Friday, Nov. 3 to include interviews with Ohio's U.S. Senate candidates and discussion about State Issue 3. The regular **NewsNight Akron** show that airs for a half hour at 9 p.m. will be followed by **NewsMaker Akron** special election coverage that will air until 11 p.m. The election feature will air again on Saturday, Nov. 4 at 4:30 a.m. and Sunday, Nov. 5 at 10:30 p.m.

NewsNight Akron host Vincent Duffy interviews Sherrod Brown and Mike DeWine separately and asks similar questions of each. Topics covered include the candidates' views on the war in Iraq, how to help middle-class Ohioans, the future of health insurance and thoughts on balancing the state budget.

Also on the **NewsMaker Akron** special, panelists Steve Hoffman and Jody Miller interview Cuyahoga County Commissioner Peter Lawson Jones, who represents advocates of Issue 3, and Rob Walgate, outreach director for the Ohio Roundtable, who presents opposing arguments. State Issue 3 is an amendment to the state's constitution that would permit up to 31,500 slot machines at seven horse racing tracks and at two Cleveland non-track locations.

Following the show's airing, more election information will be available on PBS 45 & 49's Web site, http://www.pbs4549.org, including a taped interview with gubernatorial candidate Kenneth Blackwell. The opposing candidate, Ted Strickland, declined to participate in an interview. Visitors to the Web site also will be able to view the **NewsMaker Akron** election special, which will be segmented by topic.

"We chose to interview the show's guests separately in an effort to present thoughtful discussion rather than a heated debate," said Don Freeman, PBS 45 & 49 chief operating officer. "The program and our Web site offer viewers informative, convenient ways to analyze both Ohio's Senate race and Issue 3."

NewsNight Akron airs every Friday night at 9 p.m. on PBS 45 & 49 and offers spontaneous, lively, in-depth discussions about issues that affect the lives of people in greater Akron. Serving as regular panelists on the show are Steve Hoffman, political writer at the *Akron Beacon Journal*; Jody Miller, editor and publisher of *Bath Country Journal*; and Ed Esposito, Joe Jastzremski and Larry States, all of whom are members of the Rubber City Radio Group news staff.
