KENT, Ohio — Wednesday, Feb. 24, 2010 — In observance of Holocaust Remembrance Day on Sunday, April 11, Western Reserve PBS (WNEO.1/WEAO.1) will air new and encore programming throughout the week. Fusion (WNEO.2/WEAO.2) will air special programming on Sunday afternoon, April 11.
